- Change in Capital Projects will be \$2 million higher than budgeted; all capital projects are based off profitability

5. PUBLIC HEARING

- **PUBLIC HEARING TO ALLOW PUBLIC COMMENTS REGARDING THE FISCAL YEAR 2026 BUDGET FOR UTAH INFRASTRUCTURE AGENCY (UIA)**

 - Item presented by Mr. Jason Roberts, UIA Secretary/Treasurer
 - No changes were made to the original tentative budget
 - Recurring revenue is projected to increase about \$3 million
 - Proposed increase from the previous year budget of \$8.5 million in revenues
 - Operating expenses will follow revenue and level out this year
 - Marketing and Administrative expenses are higher partly due to the door-to-door sales campaign
 - Capital Projects will stay consistent with last year
 - A UIA bond is expected for FY 2026, and most likely every fall after that, because each bond ends up creating a lot of revenue
 - The breakdown for the distribution to cities was presented and will increase about \$300,000 this year

7. UIA FINANCIAL UPDATE

- Projected results vs. adopted budget as of April 30, 2025
 - Amounts do not include May or June; he believes revenues will come in very close to budget by the end of the year
 - Marketing expenses higher than projected, partly due to door-to-door campaign
- Financial charts
 - 10 Year Monthly Recurring Revenue (Combined UIA & UTOPIA)
 - UIA passed \$4 million a month in recurring revenue
 - UIA Revenue v. Bond Obligation
- Mr. Brenn Bybee presented a request from his council to know the outstanding principal associated with the Orem debt with UTOPIA; Mr. Roberts will get that information

8. UIA NETWORK UPDATE

- Mr. Timmerman addressed a question from Ms. Lundberg regarding churn
- There have been some consolidations happening in the industry; AT&T is acquiring the residential side of Lumen (Century Link / Quantum Fiber) which will make AT&T a competitor
- Reviewed subscriber report
 - By next month the organization will have reached 75,000 subscribers
 - Just over 1,000 in net growth in the last month
 - West Haven completed
 - West Valley historically averages 20 to 30 sales per month, with the door-to-door campaign there is an average of 200 per month; at any given time, there are about 40 to 50 contracted salespeople on this campaign working in waves throughout different cities
- BEAD Program has been derailed and there is no preference for fiber
